The Tribes of Israel: A Shared Homeland for a Divided People



Explore the Diverse Tapestry of Israel through Text, Video and Discussion



Become immersed in the challenges of living in the Jewish and democratic State of Israel -- how to maintain and strengthen a shared common space for a people divided along "tribal" affiliations. Who are the diverse groups living in Israel, what challenges do they face, and what is their place in the mosaic of Israeli society? How do people divided along religious, national, and ideological lines create a shared public space? Explore principles that shape the public sphere in Israel and learn how the Israeli courts have attempted to balance competing values among Israeli tribes. The program includes video lectures and interviews and lively discussions led by a diverse CBS faculty team.
