Travel Unit I: Poland - The Jewish World That Was

Sunday October 7

• Departure from USA

Monday October 8

- Midday arrival at Warsaw's Chopin International Airport
- Head to Warsaw's **Polin Museum of the History of Polish Jews** for an overview of 1,000 years of Jewish history in Poland. *The 3.3 million Jews of Poland made up about 10% of the pre-World War II population.*
- Check-in at our hotel
- Opening Dinner

Overnight: Mercure Centrum Hotel, Warsaw

Tuesday October 9

- <u>Breakfast</u> at the hotel
- Pack bus and depart hotel
- At Warsaw's **Genscha Street Cemetery**, consider "The Life that Was". Dating to 1799, it has over 200,000 graves. It also includes mass graves for thousands of Jewish victims of the Nazis in the Warsaw ghetto.
- Explore what had been the area of **Warsaw Ghetto** including parts of the ghetto wall, UmshlagPlatz, Rappaport Memorial, Mila 18
- The 340,000 Jews of Warsaw made up about 1/3 of the city's population in 1939.
- Lunch on your own in Warsaw and then depart to Krakow.
- Head to the Nazi era Krakow Ghetto. See a section of the Ghetto Wall and the Schindler Factory Gates
- Check-in at our hotel in Krakow.
- Tour the Old Town Square of Krakow and have dinner on your own

Overnight: Galaxy Hotel, Krakow

Wednesday October 10

- <u>Breakfast</u> at the hotel
- Walking **tour** of the **Kazmierz Old Jewish Quarter** of Krakow exploring *"The World That Was"*. Sites include: Ramah Synagogue/Cemetery & Isaac and Temple Synagogues. *Prior to the Shoah the 60,000 Jews of Krakow comprised 25% of the city's population.*
- Head to the Auschwitz-Birkenau Polish State Museum & Memorial
- Packed Lunch
- Start at the Auschwitz II Birkenau Death Camp where over 1,000,000 Jews were murdered.
- Continue to the site of Auschwitz I Concentration Camp. Visit the barracks, museum exhibits and gas chamber.
- Return to Krakow. At the Krakow JCC we'll have <u>dinner</u> and meet a **member of the local Jewish community** and learn about Jewish life in Poland today.
- **Overnight:** Galaxy Hotel, *Krakow*





Travel Unit II: Prague – Traces of the Past

Thursday October 11

- <u>Breakfast</u> at the hotel
- Meet a "Righteous Gentile" who risked all to save Jews during the Shoah
- Pack bus and depart hotel to Prague
- In Moravia in the Czech Republic, we'll stop at **Boskovice** once a major Jewish center. Stroll through the narrow lanes of the old Jewish Quarter and visit the restored 17th century synagogue.
- Packed Lunch
- Late afternoon/early evening arrival in Prague; check-in at our hotel
- Walking tour at the Old Town Square of Prague followed by a dinner cruise on the Vlatlava River
- **Overnight:** Grand Bohemia Hotel, *Prague*

Friday October 12

- <u>Breakfast</u> at the hotel
- Walking tour of **Josefov**, the Old Jewish Quarter of Prague *including Europe's* oldest synagogue **Alt Neu Shul** seat of the famed 16th century Maharal (Rabbi Judah Lowy) and his mythical Golem.
- Visit the synagogues, cemetery & Judaica of the **Prague Jewish Museum** as we trace the roots of contemporary Jewish identity.
- Packed Lunch
- Stand in solemn memory at **Terezin**, site of the Nazi "showcase" Ghetto to which many of the Jews of Prague were sent before being murdered at Auschwitz and elsewhere.
- Return to the hotel to prepare for Shabbat
- Kabbalat Shabbat services with Liberal congregation Bejt Simcha.
- Shabbat Dinner
- Overnight: Grand Bohemia Hotel, Prague

Shabbat October 13

- <u>Breakfast</u> at the hotel
- Optional Shabbat morning services (Orthodox) at the opulent Jubilee Synagogue built in 1906, and named in honor of the Silver Jubilee of Emperor Franz Joseph I of Austria or take time to explore Prague on your own
- Lunch on your own
- Dinner on your own
- Evening: Head to a performance of Prague's famous Black Light Theater
- Overnight: Grand Bohemia Hotel, Prague

Sunday October 14

- <u>Breakfast</u> at the hotel
- Pack bus and depart hotel
- Explore the **Prague Castle** complex -a UNESCO World Heritage Site *founded around 880 and thought to be the largest coherent castle complex in the world.*
- Lunch and shopping time on your own
- Depart to Vienna
- Check in at our hotel
- Evening and dinner on your own
- **Overnight:** Le Meridien Hotel, Vienna





Monday October 15

- <u>Breakfast</u> at the hotel .
- We'll get a taste of the power of Imperial Vienna, seat of the Hapsburg Empire. Starting with a visit the **Schonbrunn Palace & Gardens**, former summer residence of the Hapsburgs
- Lunch and shopping time on your own
- Bus and walking tour of Vienna's major sites including: Hofburg former imperial residence, the famous Ringstrasse, St. Stephen's Cathedral and other landmarks.
- Dinner on your own
- Concert or other cultural event
- **Overnight:** Le Meridien Hotel, Vienna

Tuesday October 16

- <u>Breakfast</u> at the hotel
- Pack bus and depart the hotel.
- Tour the sites of Jewish Vienna including the Jewish Museum and the Stadtempel Synagogue, the only synagogue to survive the war, the Holocaust Memorial and the Judenplatz Museum. In the 1920s, the over 200,000 Jews of Vienna made up over 10% of the city's population. Today, there are about 10,000 Jews who make up less than 1% of the population.
- Lunch and shopping time on your own
- Depart to Budapest
- Check-in at our hotel in Budapest; evening and dinner on your own
- **Overnight:** Continental Zara Hotel, Budapest

Wednesday October 17

- Breakfast at the hotel
- In the 1930s the over 200,000 Jews of Budapest made up over 20% of the population. Today there are thought to be about 40,000 Jews in Budapest.
- Examine the development of contemporary Jewish religious ideologies and movements via the Jewish sites in the area of the **Dohany Synagogue**. We will visit the **Kazinczy Street Orthodox Synagogue**, **Dohany Street Synagogue**, **Jewish Museum and Holocaust Memorials**.
- Meet a local Jewish leader. *Learn about the challenges that Hungarian Jews face including assimilation and the reality of Hungarian anti-Semitism past and present.*
- Lunch on your own
- Take a dip at the famed Gellert Baths hot spring pools in the heart of Budapest
- Dinner and evening on your own
- **Overnight:** Continental Zara Hotel, Budapest

Thursday October 18

- Breakfast at the hotel
- Head to the area of the International Ghetto where **Moshe Krausz** together with foreign diplomats **Carl Lutz**, **Raoul Wallenberg** and others set up safe houses in 1944, thereby saving the lives of over 100,000 Jews. *Examine the saving role of the "Righteous Gentile" during the Shoah*.





- Stand in solemn memory at the **Shoes on the Danube Promenade** which remembers the Jews who were murdered in late 1944 by the Hungarian fascist Arrow Cross militiamen in Budapest
- Cross the Danube to **Castle Hill** on the Buda side of the city for dramatic views of the city from the **Fisherman's Bastion**
- Continue to the **Great Market Hall and Vaci Utca** for lunch and shopping time on your own
- Cruise on the Danube River
- Summary Session and Farewell Dinner
- **Overnight:** Continental Zara Hotel, *Budapest*
