High Holy Day Ticket Policy

Congregation Beth Shalom is an inclusive and welcoming synagogue for all those who wish to attend High Holy Day Services. High Holy Day tickets will be provided to ALL CBS members and family who live with them, including children through age 26. Sanctuary

We can seat over 700 people. Speakers are distributed throughout the sanctuary to ensure that all activities can be heard. Seating location is on an open, first-come, first-served basis. We ask everyone to be sensitive to those who may need extra assistance, and leave space for them near exits, and other more easily accessible seating. CBS has a limited number of tallit available and many kippot in the foyer. You may also wish to bring a sweater or some type of wrap as temperatures will vary in the sanctuary depending on the number of worshippers present.

Entrance and Parking

Entry is via the front main doors only. Members and guests are encouraged to park in the lined spaces provided at the synagogue. If those spaces are filled, our neighbors have graciously offered to share their parking facilities with us.

800 West 5th Avenue - Directly west of Beth Shalom, congregants may park in the spaces on the north and east sides only.

5th Avenue - There will be limited parking available on the north side of 5th Avenue. Please obey all posted signs on 5th Ave. as there is no parking on the south side of the street.

Garden and Playscape

In addition to the Play and Pray area and childcare for our young members, the garden and playscape are open for families to take their children to enjoy during services. Children must be accompanied by a parent. Please exit and enter through the lobby doors.

Childcare

Child Care will be available for First Day of Rosh Hashanah and Yom Kippur morning services. Only those who have made reservations for childcare will be guaranteed space for these programs. Selichot

Selichot are penitential poems and prayers said in the period leading up to the High Holidays. Our Selichot observance will be on Saturday evening, September 5th. Join us for a movie and discussion, movie to be announced. A light nosh will be provided. Selichot service following the movie. All are welcome.

Tashlich

Tashlich is our opportunity to symbolically cast our sins into a body of water and start the New Year with a clean slate. Please join us for our community Tashlich service shortly following services on the second day of Rosh Hashanah. Birdseed will be provided to cast away your sins, as well as a light snack. Location will be announced at services.

Community Kol Nidre

Community Kol Nidre will begin at 7 pm in the Sanctuary. Kol Nidre will be followed immediately by the Maariv (evening) service. A traditional pre-sundown Kol Nidre will be conducted at 6:00 pm in the youth lounge. Tom and Barbara Wolff will lead this participatory service with Hebrew, transliteration and music provided to enable congregants to add their voices to the lovely prayer. This service will run about 20 minutes and will be followed by Community Kol Nidre.

Yizkor Service on Yom Kippur

Yizkor service on Yom Kippur will immediately follow the morning service. It will not be before 1:15pm, last year it was at approximately 1:30pm.

Yom Kippur Study Session
